
- Best practices for bicyclists:

Maryland State Highways and Bridges Where Bicycles and Pedestrians Are Prohibited

- HIGHWAYS Bicycles are prohibited on all expressways, toll facilities, and certain posted controlled access highways.
TOTALLY PROHIBITED I-68, I-70, I-81, I-83, I-95, I-97, I-95, I-270, I-370, I-395, I-495, I-695, I-795, I-895, MD 10, MD 61 (Canal Parkway), MD 90, MD 100, MD 200, Suitland Parkway
